The Motion of Mr. Beckett
seconded by J. Walker It was
Resolved That whilst the Council
are deeply sensible of the inadequate
remuneration of Lecturers they regret
that the want of Funds to meet
the ordinary requirements of the
School prevents them requisitioning
in the recommendation of the
Administrative Council to allow
each Lecturer to receive half of
the Term Fees in addition to his
Stipendium.
