1. The Minutes of Meetings held 17<sup>th</sup> April 8<sup>th</sup> May

2. The Registrar having stated the Report of  
the Examiners in Engineering & Locomotive Driving  
Mr Caselli Esq. moved  
D. Usher seconded and it was carried  
That a 3<sup>rd</sup> class Certificate be granted  
on the recommendation of Examiners to Charles  
William Strachan as Driver of other than  
Winding Engines.
3. The Bishop moved (in accordance with his Notice)  
Mr Caselli Esq. seconded  
That Statute No. 1 Cap. 1 be so  
altered as to allow of the meetings of the  
Councils being held at 4.30 in view of  
8 o'clock P.M., in the future

the Examiners in the subject  
Moved by Mr. Freshaw  
Seconded by Mr. Koelsch and carried  
That Mr Jacob Upfold be appointed one of  
the Examiners in the subject

The Registrar suggested that Mr C. W. Thomas  
should be appointed one of the Examiners in Mining  
and Land Surveying. A long discussion ensued  
when it was at length resolved on the Motion of  
Mr Freshaw
