

both at the same time. after some conversation  
Mr. Wiseman proposed

the Bishop seconded

That the matter of increased annual  
Expenditure be considered by the Administrative  
Council and a Report submitted to the Council.

The Registrar reported that he had reason  
to believe that the Government subsidy would  
be this year twice what it was for 1878-9.  
also. that in accordance with instructions  
from the Vice-President he had seen the Hon.  
the Postmaster General who had been pleased  
to say that the Telegraph Class at the School  
should not be interfered with, but that the  
arrangements now in force with regard to lectures  
and Examiners should continue.

That he had seen the Secretary of the Pharmacy  
Board and had inspected the Case of Drugs  
a duplicate of which Mr. Skillingham had kindly  
undertaken to have prepared for the School  
at a minimum cost

That he had read in Baron v. Pomeroy M.D.

M.D. M.C.M.G. who had courteously presented  
"Organic Constituents of Plants & Vegetable Substances"  
to the School and had promised a Shorter  
series of Medicinal Plants

lastly, that no other Places of Plants than  
those possessed by the School were to be obtained  
at the present time in Melbourne

Mr. Campbell, enquired as to the petition  
of certain students in Chemistry, and how it  
was that the Disputation of students had not been

invited to attend a meeting of the Council

The Registrar read the letters he had written  
on the subject, explanatory of the case, and  
also mentioned that he had had a long  
interview on the subject with a gentleman  
whose good offices had been solicited by the  
students, and who had expressed himself quite  
satisfied that the School had done all that  
was reasonable in the matter: with which  
the Council seemed to be content.
