That he had waited on Baron v. Immer M.D. Ph.D. H.C.M.G. who had courteously presented "Organic Constituents of Plants & Vegetable Substances" to the School and had promised a Shorter Index of Medicinal Plants

Hastily, That no other Plates of Plants than those possessed by the School were to be obtained at the present time in Melbourne

Mr. Campbell, enquired as to the position of certain Students in Chemistry, and how it was that the Deputation of Students had not been

invited to attend a meeting of the Council. The Registrar read the letters he had written on the subject, explanatory of the case, and also mentioned that he had had a long interview on the subject with a gentleman whose good offices had been solicited by the Students, and who had expressed himself quite satisfied that the School had done all that was reasonable in the matter. with which the Council seemed to be content.
