

The Registrar reports:

1. That at the Council meeting held 20<sup>th</sup> U.S. the recommendations of the Admin. Council re. Fees for Pharmaceutical and Perpetual Students were adopted.
2. That the Architects Commission of 590 on Buildings be paid on the present and future works.
3. That the Government have adhered as was expected to the original Estimates in the matter of the Vote in aid of Schools of Mines.
4. That in connection with the additions now being made, it will be well to provide for an additional Lamp (at the N.E. corner of the new Class Room) and altering the position of Hydrant No. 1.
5. That in view of Donations made to the School of valuable specimens, it will be advisable to purchase if necessary some Auriferous specimens for exchange purposes.
6. That the Telegraph Sounders and Batteries recently lent to the Committee of the Free Library Ballarat West have been returned in a very damaged condition, but the Comtee have asked to be furnished with an estimate of the damage done is about £1 in value.
7. That a letter has been received from Mr. W. Roberts stating he has sold the Denny Roberts Guider and Amalgamator and asking for delivery on Friday next. This Council is advised not to accede to the request, the Machine having been placed on the ground under conditions involving considerable expense.

8. That steps have been taken to obtain for Students at the School the concessions usually made to Students attending Grammar Schools who travel by Railway from their places of residence to School.

9. That Mr. Lecturer Flude is unfortunately unable to conduct his Classes, but that temporary arrangements have been made so that Mr. Lecturer Krause carries them on during Mr. Flude's illness.

10. That the Patent Kunzberg & Co. London, have shipped for "Batavia" a collection of their patent articles for Exhibition and subsequent presentation to the School, it is feared the Collection will arrive too late for exhibiting.

That the accounts amounting to £69.16.8 be passed for payment, and in future the Advertising etc in the "Courier" be kept within the amount charged for like advertisements in the "Star".
