

It being pointed out that the April Term begins on the 25<sup>th</sup> Instant, and that sufficient time for such enquiry would not therefore be allowed, the Motion was withdrawn.

The opinion generally entertained by Members seemed to be that such an enquiry should be made, and with as little delay as possible warranted that fresh Agreements should be entered into with those Lecturers who had had their Agreements determined, and with the following modifications:— the Stipends of Messrs. Flude & Thomas to be reduced, and the Agreement with each Lecturer to be only for the current April Term; whereupon

Mr. Robt. Wilson seconded, and it was carried.

1. That Agreements be entered into, for the April Term terminating 30<sup>th</sup> June 1881, as under with

Mr. Joseph Flude, to teach Chemistry, Metallurgy, Assaying and Botany, and to perform Assays & Analyses for the School @ £300 p<sup>ann</sup>.

Mr. John Victor, to teach Mathematics (including Arithmetic) Mechanics and Natural Philosophy @ £240 p<sup>ann</sup>.

Mr. F. H. Francis, to teach Geology Mineralogy Scientific Mining Geological and Topographical Surveying and to be Curator of Museum @ £240 p<sup>ann</sup>.

Mr. W. Thomas, to teach Surveying (including Land Engineering) @ £100 p<sup>ann</sup>.

That the Agreements specify that the several Lecturers named, devote at least the number of hours set opposite their respective names, in the service of the School, during each and every week of the Term, viz

Mr. Flude 24 hours

Mr. Victor 18 "

Mr. Francis 18 "

Mr. Thomas 4 "

That for and during the current Term there be paid to Mr. Charles Flude for his services as Assistant in the Laboratories the sum of £37.10.0

2. That a Committee of the Council (as per Motion submitted and withdrawn) be appointed and set <sup>at 4 P.M.</sup> every alternate Friday from and after the 22<sup>nd</sup> Instant, until they agree upon a Report.
