receiving in the first instance, Commissioners
and Representatives having declined the responsibility
of dividing donations

Boxes of Donations, had arrived from the German
Indian, and Straits Settlements Courts, also
2 handsome Show Cases (Best pattern) with mirror backs,
The Crystal models (German Court) and the Collections
of Fossils, and Shells (Mr. Bailey) had been received
the former unfortunately bearing traces of careless
packing, some 1/2 of the models being injured.
That steps were being taken to secure a Skeleton
for The School.

That the Vice-President had privately become the
purchaser of the Japanese Anatomical model, with
the view of securing so valuable an Exhibit
for public instruction, and would probably lend
it to the Council of The School.

That the Minister of Public Instruction had been
again seen with reference to the Tower - that
gentleman had kindly promised to use his
influence with the Government so that the erection
might be proceeded with.

That fresh Agreements with Lecturers, Flude
Thomas Victor & Francaise for the April Term
only had been duly signed.

That it might be expedient in view of the
large extension of the Museum, to ask H.M.
Government to give one of the Annexes (Mr. J. G.)
recently purchased, to The School.

That the Registrar's report be received and
adopted. That all purchases made by the
Registrar on behalf of The School be approved
and all costs, including Railway Fare and
personal expenses at the rate of 15% per diem be

Exhibits &c and if possible the gift of one
of the Annexes

The Accounts amounting to £87.5.9 were
ordered to be paid

It was resolved: -

That a Committee consisting of the Vice-President
and Councilors Enoch Wilson, H.R. Caselli Esq. and
A. Stoelcher be requested to enquire into and
report on the future management of The School
as indicated in Minutes of the 8th & 14th ult.

A hearty vote of thanks to the Chair and
particularly with regard to the public spirited
action of Mr. Odde in securing so valuable
(educational) Exhibit, closed the Meeting.
