

It was resolved.

That the Registrar report be received and adopted: no further action to be taken re Amuse^{nt} (a Committee consisting of the Vice-President, Mr Caselli & the Registrar see the Hon. the Univ. of Pub. Instruction re the Lower representing to him that the reasons advanced against, should not be considered sufficiently weighty to prevent, the erection being proceeded with, - the Testing of Gauges being a much needed requirement.)

That full particulars of all Schools of Mines be collected for the information of the Council; the Vice-President having reported as Chairman of the Committee appointed to enquire into the management of this Institution, that the Committee would probably suggest steps for placing the School on a more assured basis

That fresh Agreements between the Vice-President & the several Lecturers be entered into as may appear advisable for the July Term.

That the matter of advertising in the Bazaar Monthly be left in the hands of the Vice-President and the Registrar

That the Accounts amounting to £22.2/- be passed for payment

That Mr. S. C. Gibb be admitted a Student in Materia Medica without Fees for the year in recognition of services to be rendered to the Lecturers

That a Committee consisting of the Vice President and the Registrar consider and have power to deal with any case of admitting a Student without payment of full Fees.

That the Mining Department be communiated with re Diamond Drills

To ascertain, if possible,

When such Drills are used

Particulars of Strata passed through

That application be again made to the Government for some concession as to Railway fare of Students, with a view to facilitating the teaching of the School both in the direction of Students regularly resident away from Bazaarat desirous of attending the School, and others who may attend field lectures.

That the Lecturer in Geology endeavor to obtain specimens of local rocks for the purpose of Exchange

That a Committee consisting of the Vice-President and Messrs. Hoelscher, Caselli and Fride consider and report upon the question of the treatment of Pyrites & at the School.

That steps be taken to secure Cores (Diamond drillings) and other specimens in illustration of Victorian Geology.
