Business: - To consider Report of Committee re
management of The School, &c. &c.

The Report and Appendices having been
considered, It was resolved:-

That this Council recommend to the Council as
the result of the deliberations of a Committee specially
appointed to report on the future management of
The School

1. That the services of the present lecturers
in Mathematics and Oil Painting be discontinued
and the subjects not specially taught but they
cripple the School's resources in teaching
subjects more directly of importance to Mining

2. That the services of the present lecturers
in Surveying be discontinued, and the subject
taught by the lecturer in Geology &c

3. That the services of the present lecturers
in Telegraphy be retained at the rate of £50
per annum.

4. That the Pyrites works already begun
be completed: the funds in the hands of the
Trustees or the nucleus of an Endowment being
if they can be legally, appropriated for
that purpose

5. That after the July Term is closed
it will be advisable

a. To arrange with the lecturers whose
services are retained for their private
practice at The School to be given up.

their stipends being increased accordingly.

b. To sever the subjects of Chemistry and
Metallurgy with a view to obtain the
services of a Professor in Chemistry who
will be able to give Public Lectures, and
to retain the services of Mr. Flade as
Professor in Metallurgy-
