Arrangements for ensuing (April) Term. The Vice-President stated that a sub-committee had been appointed to prepare and submit a report which had been received, considered, and adopted at a special meeting of the Administrative Council held this afternoon and recommended for the approval of this Council: Mr Campbell moved

Mr Bechervaise seconded, and it was carried That the action of the Administrative Council be confirmed

Subsequently, Mr Martell moved that the examinations be held half-yearly instead of annually. This was seconded by Mr Figgis, and agreed to.

Stipend of Demonstrator in Chemistry.— Mr Caselli moved Mr Martell seconded and it was carried— That the salary of Mr Parbridge be increased to £150 per annum.

The Vice-President gave a resume of the business which had occupied the attention of the Administrative Council during the past quarter referring to the attempt to institute popular scientific lectures in connection with The School: Also, the desirability of establishing a class in Agricultural Chemistry and the support given to the proposal. Mr Campbell moved the approval of the action taken by the Administrative Council— Mr Caselli seconded, and it was carried.

Duration of Lectures.— This matter was mentioned but no action taken.

Fresham Collection.— Mr Rosenblum moved Mr Nicholls seconded, and it was carried— That the purchase of this collection be left in the hands of the Vice-President; £75 being the sum named to offer.
