The accounts as presented together with a sum of £2.3.4 to W. Grownow, making a total of £314-11-1 were passed for payment on the motion of Mr Nicholls seconded by Mr Martell.

Assistant Olden's suspension. - The circumstances in connection with this matter were submitted. - Mr Nicholls moved, Mr Figgis seconded, and it was carried

That Mr Olden be reinstated in his former position, suffering as a punishment for his offense the forfeit of his wages from date of suspension

Lower. - Mr Caselli pointed out that the apparatus for testing gauges could not be made available until Mr Ellery had forwarded certain instructions and the matter was left in the hands of the architect with power Exhibition Show-Cases. - Mr Berry was instructed to advertise these for sale in the "Argus".

Globes. - The Council agreed that a receipt for £12.12/- for six years instruction of Stud^r Master Luke Noble who be given for the globes.

Lecture by Mr Ford. - Instructions were given to the Acting Registrar to hire chairs sufficient to seat the lecture room with the option of purchase; also to obtain lamps for reading desks. -

A requisition for Chemical apparatus required was submitted and approved.

Prizes. Mr Reid reported through the Registrar that

Mr Flude had handed him a cheque for £3.3/- to be awarded as prizes 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, for the best drawings executed by Students of his class; that the prizes had been presented by Mr Shaw in the following order: - Stud^r P. Gay, £1.11/-; J. A. Couper £1.11/-; and H. C. Major 11/-.

The hearty thanks of the Council were evoked by a presentation made through Councillor Figgis by an unknown donor of 26 vols. of scientific works

Councillor Figgis gave notice that at the next meeting of the Administrative Council he would move

"That Certificated Students on payment of £1.1/- p. Ann.
"be allowed the use of The School Library, and that
"passed Students in Chemistry or Metallurgy be
"allowed the restricted use of the Laboratories under
"the supervision of the Professor"

With a view to obtaining Students for Geology Class Councillor Martell recommended the formation of a Field Naturalists' Club and was requested to prepare and submit a scheme for consideration at next meeting
