The Accounts amounting to £ 253. 1. 5, on the motion of Dr Beechervaise, seconded by Dr Martell, were passed for payment.

Certain suggestions re Museum requirements and alterations submitted by the Curator were considered, and Dr Martell and Nicholls were appointed to confer with Mr Karsé with a view to utilising some of the show cases now in possession of The School.

Dr Nicholls moved, Dr Figgis seconded, and it was carried, "That Professor Smith's proposals to hold examinations of the State School scholars attending Lectures, and rewarding the most proficient," be approved.

Dr Figgis read and moved the motion of which he had given notice at last meeting, (Vide Minutes 7th June), Dr Beechervaise seconded, and it was carried.

Price lists of Gas Engines received from manufacturers in England were submitted. - The Vice-President pointed out the necessity of obtaining the advice, and assistance, and suggestions, of persons competent to advise in the matter of work-shop requirements, and to this end Mr Berry was instructed to convene a Special meeting of the Administrative Council for Wednesday next 12th July instant at 3. 30 P.M., inviting the attendance of the Examiners of Engineers thereat.

The visiting Committee's report for the past month was read and Dr Martell and Nicholls appointed for the ensuing month.

Mr Caselli reported that he had accompanied Messrs Ellery and Shaw on an inspection of the Tower and had now ascertained the requirements for completion of same. - Mr Caselli was authorized and requested to have the work executed without further delay. - Mr Berry was instructed to write by the
