Estimates of supplies required for the various departments of The School for the next six months were submitted and the articles named under the headings indispensable were authorized on the motion of Cr Caselli seconded by Cr Rosenblum.

Cr Béchervaise submitted That Assays and Analyses for Mining and public Companies be made and reported on at The School free of charges other than transit expenses; and contingent on the foregoing, That a paid Collector be appointed to travel the Country districts and canvass for subscriptions. - It was resolved that the subject be referred for the consideration of the Council meeting on Wednesday next.
