Class for Magnetism and Electricity. - It was agreed that Professor Smith should have the conduct of this class, and that two evenings in each week should be devoted to instruction of Students in this branch - Mr Rosenblum and Béchervaise to make the necessary arrangements.

Mr Rosenblum and Béchervaise were appointed Visiting Committee for the ensuing month, and were also appointed to consider and report to next meeting of this Council with reference to Scientific Instruments for The School.

Mr Martell gave notice that at next meeting he would move that arrangements be made for a course of lectures on Health to be delivered at The School.
