Business :- To consider and make arrangements for establishing a class at The School for practical instruction in Magnetism and Electricity, under the tuition of M<sup>r</sup> Sutton

The Vice-President referring to the action taken by the Council in January 1882 with a view to establishing classes at The School for instruction in technical physics stated that M<sup>r</sup> Sutton had been communicated with on the subject but declined at that time to accept the position of Instructor. Recently however M<sup>r</sup> Sutton had consented to undertake the duties of Lecturer and Instructor to a technical class at The School for practical instruction in applied electricity and magnetism, if the Council proposed the formation of such a class. The Vice-President read a private letter to this effect received from M<sup>r</sup> Sutton.

C<sup>r</sup> Jones moved that a class for <sup>practical</sup> instruction in applied electricity and magnetism be formed at The School; this was seconded by C<sup>r</sup> Caselli and carried.

C<sup>r</sup> Williams moved that the Vice-President, C<sup>r</sup> Béchervaise, and Figgis be constituted a sub-committee to make the necessary arrangements: seconded by C<sup>r</sup> Caselli and carried.

C<sup>r</sup> Rosenblum moved C<sup>r</sup> Béchervaise seconded and it was carried that M<sup>r</sup> Sutton be appointed Lecturer and Instructor to the class at a salary at the rate of £150 per annum, it being understood that M<sup>r</sup> Sutton will give two lessons each week during Terms to a class of senior
