C<sup>r</sup> Béchervaise moved C<sup>r</sup> Caselli seconded and it was carried. That it be an instruction to the Registrar to confer with Mr Sutton with a view to convening a meeting of the Sub-Committee lecturer, and intending students, to make arrangements for commencing the class at once and fixing the Fees for instruction.

C<sup>r</sup> Caselli moved and it was resolved that the sub-committee be authorized to procure the benches and tools requisite for the class upon ascertaining from the Instructor what would be necessary.

C<sup>r</sup> Béchervaise referred to the large number of Students attending the class in Telegraphy (32) and moved that Mr Buckidge be instructed to assist Mr Campbell the lecturer in the practical portion of the work on Monday and Thursday evenings: this was seconded by C<sup>r</sup> Figgis and carried.

A meeting of the Sub-Committee appointed at Special meeting of the Administrative Council held 23<sup>rd</sup> April ultimo to make arrangements for the commencement of a Class in applied electricity and magnetism was held at The School on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> April at 4.30 P.M.


Present - The Vice-President in the Chair, Councillors W. P. Béchervaise and S. E. Figgis members of Sub-Committee, and Mr Sutton present by invitation.

It was resolved on the motion of C<sup>r</sup> Béchervaise that the Fees for instruction in this Class be fixed at £3.3/- per Term, Students to be supplied with tools and material.

Mr Sutton produced a sketch plan showing fittings required for the work shop, and submitted a list of articles that would be necessary to obtain for use of himself and students.

The Registrar was instructed to invite tenders for the supply of the ironmongery, and to procure such articles and apparatus as in the opinion of Mr Sutton were absolutely requisite for commencing operations.

The sub-committee then inspected the building and gave instructions to have the floor filled in and the requisite fittings executed.
