

guidance of Architects in preparing Competitive designs for the proposed new buildings

(2) On the motion of C^r Nicholls seconded by C^r Martell - That a special meeting be convened to consider the same with report of Sub-Committee on buildings whenever ready to be submitted

(3) That ten weeks be the time allowed Architects to prepare Competitive designs

(4) That separate tenders for the two buildings viz. the building fronting on Lydiard Street and the building on the south side of the Laboratories, be invited.

(5) That the Penal Department be interrogated with a view to ascertaining if objection would be offered to The School erecting buildings abutting on the Gas reserve; also, with reference to windows on the south side of the lower storey

The Vice-President suggested that a temporary building to cost about £200 should be at once erected for reception of the Gas Engine and machinery, and that C^r Figgis, Williams, and the Vice-President be appointed a sub-committee with power to have the work executed without further delay. - C^r Bickett moved the adoption of the suggestion. -

C^r Martell moved an amendment - That no action be taken until the sub-committee's report be received This was seconded by C^r Nicholls and carried.

The Registrar was instructed to write to Mr Bell, M.L.B., and ask him on behalf of the Council to interview the Honorable the Chief Secretary with a view to ascertaining whether or not any objection would be offered to the erection of the proposed new buildings on the ground adjoining the Gas reserve

It was resolved that the next Annual Meeting be held on the third Wednesday in January, 1884 at 8 o'clock P.M. and that the Vice-President C^r Martell and Nicholls be appointed a Committee with the Registrar to draw up the Annual Report.
