The accounts presented amounting to £ 686.8.8 were passed for payment on the motion of C^r Rosenblum seconded by C^r Martell

It was resolved to submit the names of M^r Herbert S. Hammet, of Linnil, Gippsland, and M^r Alfred J. Taylor Librarian, Tasmanian Public Library, Hobart, with a recommendation to the Council for appointment as Honorary Correspondents

The Vice-President referred to the death of M^r Smith and it was resolved on the motion of C^r Rosenblum that a letter of condolence be forwarded to the Professor and that the School be closed until mid-day to-morrow as a mark of the Council's sympathy with the bereaved

The lecturers reports for the month of April were laid on the table. - On the recommendation of the Education Committee the reports were adopted

The attention of the Council was directed to the completion of the brickwork of the new building and the desirability of having the rooms plastered. - It was resolved that the work be executed if the funds permitted; also, that the windows be enlarged so as to admit more light if considered necessary by the Buildings Committee

C^r Rosenblum moved and C^r Martell seconded that it be a recommendation to the Council to increase the salary of M^r Koenemann to £30/- per week. - Carried.

C^r Martell and Rosenblum expressed their willingness to act and were appointed members of the Finance Committee

Confirmed June 4th 1884

A Meeting of the Mechanical Committee was held on Wednesday evening 14th May to consider and order on machinery required for new Classrooms; present, the Vice-President in the chair, C^r Lorie and Williams. - Lecturers Messrs W. St. Shaw, and St. Sutton were also present by invitation.

The Vice-President stated that the Administrative Council had authorized the expenditure of £100 for machinery for the new classrooms and this meeting had been convened for the purpose of selecting such as might be deemed most suitable and requisite. - The meeting considered the following to be the most important articles required at present, viz:-

- 1 Lathe
- 1 Vertical Drilling Machine
- 1 Band Saw
- 1 Quartz Grinder
- and a Gas Engine Starter

On the motion of C^r Williams it was resolved that M^r Shaw be appointed to select suitable machinery in Melbourne and that he be invested with general discretionary power. -

M^r Shaw accepted, and promised to inspect and report
