Martell gave notice that at next meeting of the Council he would move "That the Council take into consideration the advisability of appointing a professional board, to consist of the professors and lecturers, whose duty it will be to meet as often as required and report to the Council the different requirements of The School".

Minutes of previous meeting of the Administrative Council held 4<sup>th</sup> March ult<sup>o</sup> were read and confirmed

Accounts paid since last meeting amounting to £ 227. 1. 6 were confirmed and accounts presented amounting to £ 84. 3. 7 were passed for payment on the motion of C<sup>r</sup>. Jones seconded by C<sup>r</sup>. Martell.

The suggestion of Prof. Krause to erect a building to provide office and lecturing accommodation for himself and students in proximity to the new museum and the recommendations of the mechanical committee with regard to machinery required were referred to the Council (Quarterly meeting).

The Venerable Archdeacon Churchill Julius, M.A., and Theophilus Williams, I.P., were appointed a visiting Committee for the ensuing month.

A tender for erecting some new fencing at the entrance to The School by Mr. Kelly for £ 3. 17. 6 was accepted, the work to be executed under the superintendence of Prof. Krause; and a report on the condition of the spouting on the new museum building submitted by the plumber (Mr. Monbrough) was adopted.

The Registrar was instructed to request the proprietors of the local morning newspapers to obtain a full report of the proceedings of the Council of the University in the matter of affiliation of The School at the adjourned meeting to be held on Monday next expense of same to be defrayed by The School
