

these pupils be permitted to attend the lectures on Thursday evenings instead.

On the motion of Cr. Louie it was resolved that the following Scale of Fees be charged for attendance at lectures on this subject:— Youths under 17 years of age, 2/6 per Term; over 17 and under 21 years of age, 5/-; over 21 years (adults), 7/6;— this scale of charges applying to theoretical instruction only.

4. (c) On the motion of the Venerable Archdeacon Julius it was resolved that students attending the lectures on Astronomy should be charged the same Fees. Ultimately it was agreed that the above Scale should be adopted for purely lecture Classes only, generally.

The question of defining the privileges to which Life Governors are entitled was submitted by the Vice-President for the mature consideration of the Council.

A supplementary Report on the examinations of Astronomy Class was received and adopted.

Authority was granted for Prof. Krause to employ a boy permanently as a 'general help'; and two men for a day to remove the museum collections into the Church building.

Cr. Williams tabled the following Notice of Motion:—
"That a sub Committee be appointed to report on the management of The School and the duties of its Officers and Professors, such Committee to consist of the Venerable Archdeacon Julius, M.A., A. Anderson I.P., J. J. Jones, I.P., L. J. Martell, and W. St. Nicholls."

His Lordship the Bishop reported on the action taken, at the request of the Council, in the matter of urging the further consideration of the

affiliation question upon the notice of the University authorities. — The unsuccessful results attending similar applications from other Colleges led to unfavorable inferences. It was therefore resolved that the matter remain in abeyance for the present, a hearty vote of thanks being accorded to the Bishop on the motion of Cr. Bickett seconded by Cr. Louie.
