## BUSINESS:

1.—To consider and order on the following recommendations submitted by the Committee appointed to make inquiry and report on the question of providing for adequate teaching and extension of Drawing Class:—

- (a) That a Class for instruction in Freehand Drawing be established at The School.
- (b) That the Class be brought in association with the Technological Commission.
- (c) That a Teacher be appointed, whose duties shall include assistance in the instruction of Students in Mechanical Drawing Class.
- (d) That the room be suitably furnished to meet requirements for additional Students.

2.—To consider and determine arrangements for—

- (a) Winter Course of Lectures.
- (b) Transferring Museum Collections to Wesleyan Church building.

1.— On the motion of C<sup>r</sup> Vale seconded by C<sup>r</sup> Martell it was resolved to adopt the following recommendations submitted by the Committee appointed 13<sup>th</sup> May ultimo to make inquiry and report on the question of providing for adequate teaching and extension of Drawing Class:—

- (1) That a class for instruction in freehand drawing be established at The School
- (2) That the class be brought in association with the Technological Commission
- (3) That Mr. Hall be recommended for the position of Teacher of this class which shall meet on two evenings in each week during Term; Mr. Hall to relinquish his connection with the class at the City Free Library, and to assist Mr. Lecturer Summers

in giving instruction to students of Mechanical Drawing.

- (4) That the remuneration be fixed at £75 per annum, Mr. Hall to be allowed the use of a room for a private class on Saturday mornings; duties to commence with the July Term; C<sup>r</sup> Anderson to communicate terms of agreement. — Fees fixed at ~~14/6~~ <sup>14/6</sup> per term.

On the motion of C<sup>r</sup> Vale a committee comprising Councillors Reid, and Martell, Messrs Hall, and Summers, was appointed to consider and report to the Council on furniture required and cost of same.

2.— (a) The Lecture Committee appointed 5<sup>th</sup> May ultimo to make arrangements for the delivery of a series of lectures at The School during the winter months was reappointed — the Registrar to convene meetings by request of members. —

(b) On the motion of C<sup>r</sup> Vale seconded by C<sup>r</sup> Bickett, it was resolved that the seats on the ground-floor under the side and west end galleries in the Church building be removed, and that the museum collections be arranged therein; the seats occupying the centre space to remain in their present position for the accommodation of lecture audiences, if sufficient room be thus obtained for the collections; — the work to be executed forthwith under the direction of the buildings Committee, with discretionary power respecting the seats.

On the motion of C<sup>r</sup> Martell, Mr. Hugh Young of Camperdown, was appointed an Honorary Correspondent. — During the temporary absence of the Vice-President C<sup>r</sup> Rosenblum was appointed *locum tenens*. —

In connection with the Pharmacy Board Examinations, and Certificates, it was resolved that a correspondence be opened and that the Registrar proceed to Melbourne, and
