3.—The Quarterly Report of the Professorial Board was read and adopted.

4.—The Registrar was instructed to forward, addressed to Parliament House, a copy of the printed Circular prepared, to each member of the Legislative Assembly.

5.—The Vice-President asked to be allowed to erect and equip an Observatory on the Site gazetted as a reserve for the purpose, on the application of the Council.—Permission granted.

It was resolved on the motion of Councillor J. J. Jones seconded by Councillor E. J. Rosenblum, that application be made to the Government to increase the annual subsidy to The School to £3000.

The Consideration of Councillor Williams' motion was indefinitely postponed.

It was resolved that the next Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers be held on Thursday the 21st January 1886 at 8 o'clock P.M.

The following arrangements in connection with the formal opening of the new museum were then agreed upon, viz.:—

The Hon. Henry Cuthbert to present members of the Council of The School to His Excellency the Governor on arrival at the Railway Station. On the arrival of His Excellency at the museum, the Hon. Henry Cuthbert to present the address with an expression of the Council's regret at the absence of the Bishop through illness; and at the close of the proceedings in the museum the Governor to be asked to distribute The School of Mines Certificates granted to-day.—

Mr. J. M. Bickett and E. J. Rosenblum to occupy the positions of Vice-Chair at the luncheon: Mr. F. J. Martell and R. Wyne to be appointed marshals throughout the whole proceedings.—
