

Mr. Sutton's report relative to the decadence of the class was read. - It was resolved that after the expiration of the current term the fee for instruction in this subject be reduced to £1. 1/- per term and the remuneration of the lecturer be at the rate of £100 per annum. - The remaining items were agreed to, the Registrar being instructed to request Professor Smith to furnish for the information of the Council a Report showing the Staff required to carry on the work of the Laboratory Department.

The same Committee was subsequently appointed to enquire and report on the Staff required for the School.

Two tenders for the supply of Chemicals received from Messrs W.H. Malyon, and Cornell & King were referred to the Superintendent of Laboratories for examination, the lowest tender to be accepted.

The Registrar was instructed to make application to the City Council for a street lamp to be erected in front of the main building.
