The monthly Progress reports for March submitted  
by the Professors and Lecturers were adopted. - Authority  
was granted to employ a man (laborer) for a few days  
to clean up the walks and grounds and a requisition for  
chemicals and apparatus &c amounting to £  
was approved.

The Registrar was instructed to comply with the  
suggestions of the Railway Commissioners in obtaining the  
signatures and address of students at the commencement of  
each quarter prior to granting railway tickets at the rates  
allowed by the Department

The Council consented to the proposal of Mr. Irwin  
who requested (through Mr. Bechervaise) to be permitted to  
present a gold medal to the best all round Student in  
Chemistry, &c. who was associated with the late (student)  
John Irwin as a grateful recognition of the good kind feeling
