Educational Progress Reports submitted by the Professors and lecturers were adopted

A request from Professor McCoy that the National Museum might be allowed to obtain by exchange a Bird of Paradise in the School's collection (*Paradisaea sepietacea*) for specimens of other species was acquiesced in, the Council deeming it very important that rare species should be represented in the National Museum of the Colony.

An offer to publish the School's Advertisement in the "People's Tribune" newspaper received from Mr C. E. Jones, M.L.A. was declined

A copy of the New South Wales Parliamentary Debates for the week ended 28th May last containing some complimentary allusions to the School together with a letter from the Secretary to the Premier advising transmission of same was laid on the table for perusal

In compliance with request of Mr St. John, (taxidermist) a further advance payment of £23 was authorized
