Minutes of previous meeting held 6th October were read and confirmed

Accounts paid since last meeting £212. 6. 7 were confirmed and accounts presented amounting to £102. 3. 1/2 making a total of £314. 9. 7 were passed for payment. Progress Reports submitted by the Professors were received and a requisition for two books - to cost £2. 12. 6. was approved. - It was resolved that a book be obtained showing the commercial value of gold of different degrees of fineness. -

A memorandum was received from Professor Smith suggesting that some of the material required for the laboratories might be obtained from England and thus effect a saving to The School. - It was resolved that the apparatus and chemicals (except the strong acids) required for the year 1887 should be ordered direct from England, Professor Smith to select the firm likely to meet our wants most fully and economically

A letter received from Langlands Foundry Melbourne offering to supply a set of (3) Wheelers pans for £140 was submitted. - Consideration postponed.
