The Professorial reports submitted were adopted Professor Smith to be requested to furnish a report on the most efficacious means of dissipating the fumes created in the laboratories - the Vice-President and C^r Reid to make arrangements for required alterations in lighting drawing Classroom.

An application from Miss Guerin M. A., for the use of a room at The School for two hours per day, required for the formation of a ladies' literary and science class was granted for six months. - An application was also received from M^r F. St. John in reference to his forming a taxidermy class at The School. - Granted if room can be found.

A communication from Prof. Trause referring to his being elected a Fellow of the Linnæan Society of London, Admission Fee, Annual Contribution, &c., was submitted, and C^r Martell was requested to confer with members of the Field Club in regard to the amount to be subscribed.
