Minutes of previous meeting held 7th March ultimo
were read and confirmed on the motion of Cr Vale
Accounts paid since last meeting amounting to
£744.14.10 were confirmed; and Accounts presented,
amounting to £153.9.0 were referred to Finance
Committee, to be paid if found correct. -

Monthly Progress Reports submitted by Professor Smith
and the lecturers on Botany and Telegraphy were laid
on the table.

The Correspondence inwards received since previous meeting
was submitted - including the following -

From Secretary Education Department stating that there
was no objection to the holder of a State School Scholarship
changing the place of his education at the end of a year:

From Secretary Adelaide Jubilee Exhibition intimating
that the exhibits sent by The School to the Colonial
and Indian Exhibition, London, would be forwarded to
the Adelaide Exhibition: - From the Secretary, Colonial
and Indian Exhibition stating that a diploma and
Commemorative Medal had been awarded to The School:

From Secretary Ballaarat District Teachers' Association
asking for the use of rooms at The School for a
conference on Good Friday and a Banquet on the
following day - Granted: From Secretary Victorian
Railways submitting draft of Regulations for the issue
of Railway Tickets to Students - The Council approved

the first portion of Clause 3 which specifies that "No ticket is to be
issued unless the purchaser is a Student of The
School of Mines paying not less than £1.1/- per Quarter"
The Council suggest the substitution of 5/- for £1.1/-:
