

Duties and Powers of Administrative Council

and Subscribers.

The Administrative Council shall have the executive control of The School with power at any special meeting thereof convened for the purpose, to suspend or dismiss Professors, Lecturers, Curator, Registrar, or any other Officer or servant, provided that such suspensions or dismissals shall be subject to appeal to the Council; and shall control all examinations, the revenues of The School and their expenditure, in conformity with the Estimates approved of by the Council annually.

Meetings of Administrative Council

The Administrative Council shall meet ^{regularly} not less than once a month, the day and time of such meeting to be fixed by the Administrative Council at their first meeting in each year. - Special meetings of the Administrative Council may be convened by the President or Vice-President.

Governors and Subscribers

A donation of Twenty Pounds (£20) shall constitute the donor thereof a Life Governor. - An annual contribution of Two Guineas (£2.2/-) shall constitute the donor thereof an Annual Governor; and the annual subscription of One Guinea (£1.1/-) shall constitute the donor thereof an Annual Subscriber. Any new Subscriber shall not be entitled to vote at any election unless his subscription shall have been paid three months previous to the day of election.

Expenditure

(1) No person whether a member of the Council or otherwise shall incur expenditure or liability of any kind unless under authority of a directing resolution of the Council or Administrative Council; and all orders involving expenditure of money, except moneys placed at the disposal of the President shall be in writing and signed by the Chairman of the meeting authorizing such expenditure, and by the Registrar. - Duplicates of all orders involving expenditure shall be laid by

the Registrar before the Administrative Council at its next meeting after the issue of such orders.

(2) All ordinary expenditure of money such as for stores, fuel, etc., exceeding Five Pounds (£5) shall be subject to the calling of tenders for the same. +

The conditions specified in the Statute of the University, scheduled hereto shall be strictly complied with in the administration of The School.

Statute for the affiliation of the School of Mines and Industries, Ballarat

As Amended and Adopted by the Senate.

Whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto has been granted by the Crown by a certain deed of grant dated the Seventh day of July, A.D. 1884, to Sir William John Clarke, Revett Henry Bland, and John Warrington Rogers, to be held by them as Trustees subject to certain conditions, provisions and declarations set forth in such grant, among which is a condition that the said land and buildings thereupon shall be used and maintained as and for an Educational Establishment, known as the School of Mines and Industries, Ballarat: And Whereas by the eighth section of the Act of Incorporation of the University of Melbourne it is made lawful for the said University to make any Statutes for the affiliation to or connection with the name of any College or Educational Establishment to which the governing body may consent, provided that no such Statute shall affect the religious observances or regulations enforced in such College or Educational Establishment and the Trustees and governing body of the Educational Establishment first above-mentioned are desirous that the same be affiliated to the said University: Now therefore it is hereby provided
