Business : - To consider and determine on the erection of a detached building for Mineralogical Laboratory and Curator's Office combined

On the motion of C^r Beecheraise seconded by C^r Martell it was resolved that the building be erected in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted; that tenders returnable within a week be invited by advertisement in the local papers, and that the Vice-President be authorised to deal with the same to the best advantage.

The Vice-President was also empowered to dispose of the machinery to the Government on the terms they might offer to purchase.

Councillors Martell and Roseblum with Professors Smith and Krause were appointed to draft new Statutes for the School.
