Special Meeting of { Tuesday 5 P.M.
Administrative Council { September 13th 1887.

Present - His Worship the Mayor of Ballarat East in the Chair, the Ven. Archdeacon Churchill Julius, M.A., the Hon. Treasurer, W. F. Bickerwaise, F. J. Martell, and R. Wynne

Business : - To consider and take steps to protect the property of the School.

The Curator had reported that sometime between Saturday evening and Monday morning last the Museum had been forcibly entered and a showcase, secured by a lock, containing the coin collection had been broken open and 153 pieces, chiefly silver, including the medal received from the Ballarat Juvenile Industrial Exhibition, abstracted therefrom.

On the motion of Cr Jones seconded by Cr Wynne it was decided that a reward of £10 be offered by advertisement in the local papers for information that would lead to the conviction of the offenders.

It was also resolved on the motion of Cr Bickerwaise seconded by the Ven. Archdeacon - That the Hon. Treasurer be authorized to select and purchase a suitable fire-proof safe in which the Books and valuable property of the School should be deposited for safe keeping.

Business : - To pass Accounts and to transact ordinary business.

Minutes of previous ordinary meeting held 5th September ultimo and of special meeting held on the 13th idem were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since previous meeting £211. 7. 8 were confirmed and the Accounts presented amounting to £15. 4. 0 making a total of £226. 11. 8 were, on the recommendation of the Finance Committee, passed for payment.

Monthly Progress Reports submitted by Teaching Staff were received and adopted. - The requisition for models, &c. for Drawing Classes made by Mr Hall to be left in the hands of Cr Martell to expend not more than the amount previously estimated and sanctioned by the Council.

Correspondence received during the month included the following: - From Secretary Centennial International Exhibition 1888, inviting the co-operation of the Council in regard to exhibits connected with mining and the associated industries.
