

## The School of Mines, Ballarat.

Ordinary Meeting of Administrative Council } Monday 4.30 pm.  
May 7<sup>th</sup> 1888.

Present - The Vice-President, in the Chair, Councillors the Ven. Archdeacon Julius, the Rev. D. Roseby, R. S. Vale, M. A. W. P. Beechewise, J. Louie, and F. J. Martell.

An apology was received for the absence of His Lordship the Bishop.

Minutes of previous meeting held on the 9<sup>th</sup> ultimo were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since previous meeting £422.13.4 were confirmed and the Accounts presented amounting to £150.5.8 making a total of £572.19.0 were passed for payment.

Monthly Progress Reports for the month of April were submitted by Professor Krause, Lecturers Messrs Baley and Campbell. - The Registrar was instructed to request the Teaching Staff to furnish their monthly reports regularly. - Professor Krause's requisition for four additional show cases for the Museum was approved.

An application for an increase of salary received from Mr. Lecturer Walker was referred to the Education Committee for consideration and report.

A communication received from Mr. Lindt of Melbourne offering 6 mounted views of New Guinean scenery for sale was read, and Mr. Vale was requested to inspect the same when in Melbourne with a view to securing the set if considered of sufficient merit. - The thanks of the Council were tendered to the Rev. D. Roseby, for the presentation of 12 tickets admitting as many students of The School to a series of 3 lectures on Popular Astronomy. - It was decided that The School could not grant a Certificate of Competency to a former student (F. W. Longstaff) on account of his not having entered for examination here. - A provisional
