(d) Councillor Martell reported the result of an interview with Mr. D. McAlpine in reference to lectures on Biology. - The further consideration of this question was postponed. - The Vice-President reported that arrangements had been made for Mr. Sawbarn to conduct the classes in Mathematics and Astronomy.

- 5.- It was resolved that the Reverend William Williams of Eaglehawk, Sandhurst, be appointed an Honorary Correspondent of The School.
- 6.- The consideration of Motion on Notice by Cr. Martell was deferred to allow Cr. Vale an opportunity to draft Regulations under which the Fees charged for Assays might be remitted, the same to be submitted at next meeting of the Council.
- 7.- Correspondence from the Education Department referring to the application for a Special Grant of £3,500 for Buildings and Apparatus was laid on the table. No action taken.
- 8.- The Council declined to entertain the question of asking the Railway authorities to grant any further concession to Students of The School travelling from the neighbouring Colonies. - It was unanimously resolved that His Worship the Mayor of the City Colonel the Honourable W. Collard Smith, M.L.C. be invited to formally open the new Mining Laboratory and start the machinery in connection therewith; that refreshments be provided for the occasion; invitations and all other arrangements to be left in the hands of the Vice-President with power.

It was resolved that Mr. Watts, Battery manager at the Band and Albon Consols mine, be requested to exercise a general supervision of the milling operations

carried on in the Mining Laboratory.

Cr. Martell referred to the case of Students who had elected to take out their Scholarships in the Geology class having too few opportunities of presenting for examination during the year. - The matter was referred to the Education Department Committee
