November 5th 1888.

Present - The Vice-President in the Chair,
Councillors J. J. Jones J.P., Theo. Williams J.P.,
F. J. Martell and E. J. Rosenblum. - Apologies for
unavoidable absence were received from His Lordship
the Bishop and Archdeacon Julius

Minutes of previous meeting held 8th October ultimo
were read and confirmed. -

Accounts paid since previous meeting amounting to
£241.4.11 were confirmed; and the Accounts presented
£123.12.1 examined and Certified by the Finance
Committee were passed for payment

Progress Reports for the month of October submitted
by the Staff were read, and it was resolved

(1) - That Professor Strouse's requisition for a new
Register Book for a Museum Catalogue to cost £3
be approved; also, that a laborer be employed for a
week to clear the School grounds.

(2) That Professor Smith's Memorandum referring
to machinery required for the Mining Laboratory, and
a communication from J. Segurtha offering to erect
a self acting Pyrites roasting Furnace for the sum of
£120 be referred to the Mining and Machinery Committee
with power.

A letter from the Registrar of the University
notifying the appointment of two representatives on the
Council of the School was read. - In replying thereto
the Registrar was instructed to suggest the appointment
of Inspector Samuel Summons M.A., L.L.B., Melb. in
place of Mr James Holland M.A., on the grounds
that the former is a resident of Ballarat, and the
latter, ^{being} located in Melbourne would possibly have few
