Ordinary Meeting of } Monday 4.30 P.M.  
Administrative Council } March 4<sup>th</sup> 1889.

Present The Vice-President in the Chair, Councillors  
Dr. Hudson, Dr. Fimmell, W. P. Becherwise, F. J. Martell,  
and R. S. Vale M.D.A.

Minutes of previous meeting held 4<sup>th</sup> February ultimo  
were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since previous meeting £248. 3. 8  
were confirmed and accounts presented amounting to  
£83. 12. 2 were passed for payment.

Progress Reports for the past month submitted  
by Teaching Staff were received.

It was resolved that Mr. Bradley be allowed  
£8. 8. 0 remuneration for lecturing to the Mathematical  
Class during February and that his services be  
retained for the current month.

A letter from the Bishop addressed to the Vice-  
President was read, and the Registrar was instructed  
to reply thereto.

It was resolved on the motion of Dr. Hudson that  
His Lordship the Bishop be asked to make enquiries  
in England with respect to Science Teachers and  
science instruction generally for the information of  
the Council of The School.

A letter received from Messrs Pfaff, Pinschof & Co. Melb.  
containing a request for a collection of minerals for  
the Stamburgh Exhibition was referred to Prof. Krause  
and the Vice-President with power.

On the motion of Mr. Becherwise seconded by Mr. Vale  
the offer of the Langlands Foundry Coy to supply a  
set of Wheelers Pans (2 Grinders and 1 Concentrator)  
for the sum of £138 was accepted.

An offer of Messrs Gregory & Co. to supply certain

machinery was referred to the Mining and Machinery  
Committee for consideration.

Mr. J. Gregurtha's account for £120 (Contract price)  
for erection of Roasting Furnace was passed for  
payment subject to the Certificate of Mr. Robertson.
