The lectures, also the supervision over the students working in the laboratories, should be fully stated The time-table to be drawn up by the stuff without further delay and submitted to the Administrative Council at its next meeting. - That a responsible Officer should be always present in the room with Laboratory Students for the purpose of exercising a proper supervision and rendering any needful assistance (2) - That the lectures delivered by Mr Walker in the State Schools - now spread over four days of the week be given in two, on Mondays and Thursdays. (3) - That duplicate sets of specimens of all ordinary minerals and rocks be provided and made available for handling and examination by students. (4) - That Mr Figgis, architect, be requested to advise the Conneil on the best means of obtaining an increase of light within the museum building. (5)-That an elderly man be engaged to make himself generally useful and sleep on the premises; the cottage at present occupied by the Registrar to be utilized for Laboratory and other purposes. It was resolved that in future Examinations shall be conducted by the Infessors and Lecturers on the staff of The School. Or Lindsuy referred to the low charges made by The School for treating test-samples of pyrites. - At the request of the Vice- Fresident Or Williams promised to confer with Infersor Swith in reference to this matter 7 betr. 1591 Julymann
