

- (3) - A memorandum referring to the expediency of appointing an assistant mineralogist, etc., received from Professor Trause and submitted at previous meeting of Administrative Council was read together with a proposed Curriculum for first, second, and third years' courses in Geology and Mineralogy. A letter from Professor Smith and accompanying Draft of Laboratory portion of Curriculum for a three years' course for the diploma of Associate of The School were read and on the motion of Councillor Molloy it was resolved that these documents be referred to the Administrative Council and Education Committee for consideration and adoption on approval or with emendations: Mr. Horwood to be requested to submit a Curriculum for a three-years' course in Engineering, etc.

- (5) - This matter had been dealt with at meeting of Administrative Council on the previous day.

- (6) - Letter from Education Department noting approval of Plans for the proposed new buildings, etc. was read. It was resolved that the Architects be requested to furnish the information required by the Architect, Public Works Department, in reference to the precautions to be taken to guard against inequality of settlement.

- (4) - Mr. R. Hedger Wallace was introduced to the Council and in reply to the remarks of Councillor Rosenblum on the financial aspect of the question stated that The School might rely on the support and assistance of the Minister of Agriculture, if the subject were included in the curriculum, and the requisite instruction provided. The action of the Administrative Council in proposing a conference with the Agricultural and Pastoral Association was confirmed on the motion of Councillor Molloy. Councillor Rosenblum moved 'That this Council approves

of the establishment of a Department of Agriculture in connection with The School; Seconded by Councillor Lindsey and carried, provided that the Government supply any additional teaching power required.

It was resolved on the motion of Councillor Martell - That this Council approves of the affiliation of a limited number of local boarding houses <sup>with The School. (May 2 or 3)</sup> for the convenience of students living at a distance from Ballarat. - The regulations necessary, such as those referring to payments to be made, hours to be observed, religious services on Sundays, and correct behaviour of students to be drawn up by the Administrative Council
