The Vice-President C<sup>o</sup>-Lomie and Martell were appointed a Committee with the Registrar to prepare Draft Annual Report.

Ordinary Meeting of Tuesday 4.30 p.m.  
Administrative Council 3 January 6<sup>th</sup> 1891.

Present. - The Vice-President in the Chair, Councillors S. E. Figgis, Mr. Lindsay, J. Lomie, Dr Pincock and G. I. Rosenblum.

Minutes of previous meeting held 9<sup>th</sup> December ultmo were read and confirmed.

Accounts amounting to £ 321. 4. 2 paid since previous meeting were confirmed and the Accounts presented for payment £ 41. 18. 7 making a total of £ 363. 2. 9 were passed for payment. -

In reference to the establishment of a class for instruction in Electricity (applied) a letter from Mr J. A. Dawson of Geelong offering his services as Lecturer and a commendatory letter from Councillor Martell were read. Councillors S. E. Figgis, Dr Pincock, and G. I. Rosenblum, were appointed a Committee to confer with Mr Murray and make inquiries respecting the equipment necessary for giving instruction to a class in applied electricity, and the cost of same - the Registrar to write and ascertain when Mr Murray would be in Ballarat and when it would be convenient for him to confer with the Committee on the subject. -

With a view to testing the relative cost of driving the Mining Laboratory machinery by steam or gas it was resolved that arrangements be made for working with steam for a month or six weeks using wood and coke for fuel and noting the cost.

The Vice-President and Dr Pincock were appointed a deputation to wait on the Hon. the Minister of Public Instruction to ask for a Special Grant for Buildings.

It was resolved that Professor Krause be asked to make arrangements if possible to conduct an evening class in Mineralogy
