Minutes of previous meeting held 5th January ultimo were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since previous meeting £357. 2. 8 and the accounts presented amounting to £296. 3. 1 making a total of £647. 5. 9 were passed for payment.

Progress Reports for the past month submitted by Staff were received. - The requisitions of Professor Brause for blinds for northern skylight in museum, and of Professor Smith for Chemicals and Chemical Apparatus, from Ruzogque Baridges & Co London, six scientific journals, sundry articles required for Chemical and Mining Laboratories were approved.

Referring to the proposed curriculum for Associateship of the School in Mining Engineering, Metallurgy, or Geology, the Bishop whilst agreeing with the Courses of instruction prescribed pointed out that the Council could not confer a degree in these subjects, having no charter, and suggested that the syllabuses might be submitted for approval of the University. - It was therefore decided that the document to be issued to students absolving any of these courses should be designated a Certificate of Associateship of the Ballarat School of Mines in the subject in which the student had passed the prescribed examinations.

The Registrar was instructed to inform Mr. Rusembe that the full premium of One Hundred Guineas need not necessarily be all paid before commencing the course in Mining Engineering.
