

A letter from student John A. Hamilton requesting cancellation of his indenture and refund of a portion of the premium paid was considered in connection with reports from Professor Smith and Mr. Lecturer Walker.

It was resolved - That the request of Mr. Hamilton as to release from indenture be granted, his intention to visit Denver being a sufficient reason. - The Council deem the rest of the letter uncalled for as the full agreement under the indenture was kept; copies of the professional reports to be forwarded to him.

The Registrar was instructed to write to the Education Department in reference to special grant in aid of buildings.

The Bishop intimated his intention to bring forward a motion in regard to meetings of the Council being held more frequently.

Councillor Martell drew attention to the necessity of increased outhouse accommodation at The School and it was decided that ample provision be made for the purpose required.

Councillors F. J. Martell and R. S. Vale were appointed a visiting committee for the ensuing month.

The following questions were submitted to Professor Smith by the visiting committee Messrs Lindsay and Rosenblum in order to elicit full information as to matters relating to students, Trainees in general and Mr. Hamilton in particular.

- 1.- Has he complied with directions referring to attendance at lectures and practical work and other duties as specified in the indentures?
- 2.- What is the usual progress expected of students - Trainees to be made at the end of each half-year?
- 3.- What is the result of Mr. Hamilton's examinations?
- 4.- If not satisfactory, can you assign a cause?

5.- Is Mr. Hamilton earnest in his studies and continuous in his application to them?

6.- Have all the lectures been delivered in the three-years' course since its establishment?

7.- Compare the advantages of the indentured student with those of the ordinary student both with reference to instruction and monetary cost, taking the full number of subjects included in the course as a basis.

8.- Have the terms of the indentures for Student Assistants (or Trainees) been carried out by The School?

Note. - This Committee recommend the appointment of a sub-committee to revise the indentures. -
