Minutes of previous meeting held 13th January intm. were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since last meeting £341. 4. 0 were confirmed and Accounts presented for payment amounting to £111. 14. 10, making a total of £452. 17. 10 were passed for payment

Progress Reports submitted by the Staff were read and a requisition for chemicals and apparatus for the laboratories amounting to £46. 16. 11 was approved. - The addition of a second separator for the Wheeler's pans and a tail pan to the mining laboratory plant recommended by Professor Smith was referred to the mining laboratory committee. - Mr. Dawson's suggestions in regard to additions to the Electrical laboratory appliances were also referred to the same committee. - The proposals submitted by Professor Smith to limit the free nominations and free scholarships to lecture classes only and to adopt a sliding scale of fees for laboratory practice was referred to the Education Committee for consideration and report. - The correspondence intwards included syllabuses of instruction in Geology, Mineralogy, and Botany prescribed by the Education Department, and a letter from the Pharmacy Board notifying the Council that the lectures on Materia Medica delivered at the School by Dr. Gutheil would be recognized as heretofore. - The Registrar was instructed to write to the Education and Railway Departments in reference to this matter with a view to obtaining a grant for teaching
