(1) - Minutes of previous ordinary and special meetings held respec-
tively on 28th April ult. and 15th May inst were read and confirmed.

(2) - The recommendation of the Administrative Council passed
at meeting held 10th March to institute an Examination
for Master Plumbers' Certificates was adopted and a Committee
consisting of the President, Vice-President Dr. Finnoch,
Councillors S. E. Figgis, and Theo. Williams, was appointed
to make arrangements for carrying out the same by a
competent Board of Examiners.

(3) - An application to be admitted to the Associateship of
The School in Metallurgy, received from past student
W. J. Brown was read and referred to the Professorial
Board for report. - A request submitted by past student
A. E. Stogue for duplicates of Certificates issued to him by
The School was acceded to the originals having been
accidentally destroyed by fire.

the request complied with.
