2. - The recommendation of the Professional Board to limit the Forms of Certificate to (1) Stage, (2) Final, and (3) Associateship, was approved, all other Forms hitherto used to be cancelled, and blank copies now in stock to be destroyed: also that a fresh certificate be drawn out for Mr. Hall in accordance with the above suggestion. - The subject proposed by Mr. Grower for a thesis to be submitted by him for the Associateship in Metallurgy was approved, it being understood that all such documents become the property of The School. - Proposals for reduction of the working expenses in the Mining Laboratory submitted by Professor Smith were adopted as follows - Heads of shifts to divide the Sunday work amongst them without charge, and the three assistants to be paid at the rate of 10/- a week each.
