Minutes of previous meeting held 9th June ultimo were read and confirmed.

Accounts paid since previous meeting amounting to £342.11.10 were confirmed, and the Accounts presented £89.5.8 making a total of £431.17.6 were passed for payment. -

Auditor's Report and Balance-sheet for the Staff-year ended 30th June ult. were read and received.
