Minutes of previous meeting held on the 15<sup>th</sup> March ult<sup>r</sup> were read and confirmed. -

Accounts paid since last meeting amounting to £249. 16. 9 were confirmed and the Accounts presented £160. 13. 10 making a total of £410. 10. 7 were passed for payment.

Progress Reports submitted by the Staff were received. A letter from Professor Horwood tendering his resignation of the lectureship on Engineering and Surveying was read and received with expressions of regret at losing the services of a competent and diligent officer. - It was resolved that a testimonial to this effect be presented to Mr Horwood. - The Registrar was instructed to advertise for a gentleman qualified to undertake the duties at a salary of £275 per annum.

The Scale of Fees as published on p. 10 of the Calendar was adopted on the recommendation of the Education Committee.

A letter under date of the 10<sup>th</sup> inst. from the University was read and on the motion of the Bishop seconded by Vice-president F. J. Martell the following Resolutions were carried unanimously, viz:-

1. - That this Council having been assured by its legal advisers that the notice received from the Council of the University of the termination of affiliation twelve months after date is invalid, has no option but to decline to accept the same.
2. - That this Council regrets that the Council of the University has not seen fit to withdraw its notice terminating the affiliation in accordance with the suggestion courteously conveyed by the President with a view to a friendly mutual
