 in writing; and that a copy of this
 resolution be handed to every member
 of the staff" Carried Unanimously

 Mr. Vale { that Prof. Krause be informed
 Mr. Lindsay } that his engagement with
 The Melbourne University cannot be
 allowed + Amendment carried
 Mr. Vale { that Mr. Dawson's application for
 Mr. Rice } six months leave for the purpose
 of visiting England and America
 be declined.

The Bishop { that the matter be referred to
 Mr. Middleton } subcommittee for enquiry to
 report to this Council at an early date
