 Minutes of previous meetings held
 21st Feb and 6th Mar were read
 and confirmed
 Accounts amounting to £348.17.8
 were passed for payment
 Reports from the Director and
 Board of Examiners were received
 and adopted -
 Attention was called to the fact
 that Mining is not taught as
 an evening subject and it was
 resolved to ask Professor Purdie
 to make provision for holding such
 classes during next term -
 a letter was received from Mr
 McDougall asking for increased
 charges - Action postponed
 The appointment of a successor to
 Mr T. A. Dawson Lecturer of
 Electricity was next considered
 when Mr W. Huey Steele M.A. having
 secured the highest number of votes
 was declared elected
 The Hon R. J. Vale M.P. was
 unanimously elected to act as
 Vice President as Mr Figgis
 resigned.
