Minutes of previous meetings held  
21st Feb. and 6<sup>th</sup> Mar were read  
and confirmed  
Accounts amounting to £348-17-8  
were passed for payment  
Reports from the Director and  
Board of Examiners were received  
and adopted -  
Attention was called to the fact  
that Mineralogy is not taught as  
an evening subject and it was  
resolved to ask Professor Purdie  
to make provision for holding such  
classes during next term -  
A letter was received from Mr  
Mc Dougall asking for increased  
expenditure which postponed  
the appointment of a successor to  
Mr. A. Dawson Teacher of  
Electricity was not considered  
when Mr. J. F. Steele M.L.A. having  
secured the highest number of votes  
was declared elected  
The Hon. P. J. Vale M.L.A. was  
unanimously elected to act as  
Vice President since Mr. Steele
