Special Meeting of Council

To consider report of Committee to consider matters in connection with art schools Friday 14th June 1907

The President introduced Mr. Geo. Buchanan

who then took his seat as a member of Council

The President reported that he had received

a letter from V.P. R.D. Vale announcing

the death of Mr. J. Deunant and that he

would be absent from the meeting in con-

sequence. The President & V.P. J.M. Bickett

both eulogized the good work done for the

School and science teaching generally

by the late Mr. Deunant whose death

they much deplored.

The Council then proceeded with the special

business for which the meeting had been called

and it was resolved

1st That all secretarial work in connection with

the carrying on of the Art and Trade classes be

undertaken by the School of Mines staff

2nd That £36 per annum be paid to the caretaker

Ballarat West, and £13 per annum be paid to

the caretaker Ballarat East

3rd That the salaries of Messrs J.H. Powell and J.H. Eddy

be at the rate of £36 per annum to the end of

the current year

4th That the management of the teaching of Art

work be under one Principal

Mr. Vickery 5th That the salary attached to the position be £300

per annum, with the right to retain the amounts

now granted by the Education Department

for the instruction of State School Teachers and

pupils of the Continuation School.

Mr. Nevitt 6th That the appointments of Principals be offered

to Mr. Herbert St. Smith

7th That the class in Engineering Drawing

Ballarat East be discontinued

8th That the class in Signwriting Ballarat West

be discontinued and that the class in

Signwriting Ballarat East conducted by

Mr. Barber be continued.

9th That the Dresscutting classes Ballarat East

and West, and the class in Millinery

Ballarat West be continued

10th That Mr. Tooke's services be retained

at a salary of £150 per annum

11th That Miss Young's services be retained

at a salary of £70 per annum

12th That Mr. Steane be retained to carry on

the Carpentry classes at £75 per annum

13th That Mr. Kelle & Mr. Kerr's classes be con-

tinued as usual

14th That Mr. Drummond's services be retained

and that for the present he be paid at the

rate of £52 per annum

15th That Mr. Pegg's classes in Building Con-

struction be continued and that he be paid

at the rate of £70 per annum

16th That Mr. A. Deane, Thos. A. Jackson, W. Middleton

and J. Vickery be as a supervising committee over the

Art schools for the present
