

3. 2. 1915 Finance Committee

The School of Mines and Industries, Ballarat.  
Special Meeting of the Finance Committee  
appointed to deal with the recommendations  
made by Mr. Donald Clark in connection  
with the School's finances. Date of the  
meeting - 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 1915.

Present, <sup>The President</sup> Mr. W. H. Middleton in the chair,  
Councillor R. Maddern, Messrs. C. Fenner and  
H. H. Smith.

The minutes of the previous meeting held on  
the 27<sup>th</sup> ultimo were taken as read.

Resolved that <sup>for the present year</sup> the teacher in Accountancy <sup>for the present year</sup> be  
paid Students' fees in lieu of salary & that he  
receive all conveniences for conducting his  
classes.

Resolved that the Photography class be  
abandoned until the new Art School Buildings  
are completed.

Resolved that the Instructor in Pattern-making  
be paid, for this year, a retaining fee of £10  
plus all the fees received, & that Mr. Friend  
be informed that this arrangement is to hold  
good for this year only and that, if circumstances  
permit, the class will be carried on next  
year on the old basis.

[Note. After conference with the instructor,  
this class has been discontinued.]

Resolved that there be one full time instructor  
in Carpentry instead of three part-time men,  
& that the instructor be required to undertake  
all the Carpentry work of the school both  
Senior and Junior. It was further resolved  
that applications be called for & that the  
Ballarat East branch be discontinued and  
that each member of the staff be notified to this effect.

3. 2. 1915 (continued)

Resolved that the Sign-writing class be conducted  
by Mr. K. Moss, and that Mr. W. J. Hall's services  
be dispensed with.

The recommendation that the new Art School  
buildings be completed as soon as possible was  
adopted. It was also decided to record the fact  
that the school authorities had made every effort  
to hasten the work, but that the Department  
had checked progress by delaying the  
construction of the fittings.

It was resolved ~~that~~ to notify the Instructor  
in Blacksmithing that the class would be  
discontinued until the workshop had been newly  
equipped & that three applications for an instructor  
would be called for.

It was resolved that the class in wool-sorting  
and classing be discontinued until there was  
a better demand for it.

[Note. Since this resolution was carried the class  
has been re-established under Mr. J. H. Smith who  
has agreed to receive the students' fees in lieu  
of salary.]

In order to conform with the rule of paying  
professional men at the rate of £1. per night,  
and non-professional men at 10/- per night, it  
was resolved to reduce Mr. A. E. Kerr's salary  
by £7. 10/- and to increase Mr. D. E. Mullins's by  
the same amount.

It was resolved that the Dress-making class  
at Ballarat East be discontinued.

It was resolved to suggest to the Education  
Department that Miss Wright's classes be transferred  
to the School of Domestic Economy that is to be  
opened shortly in Ballarat.
